## License Renewals

Kentucky professional engineers need to electronically renew their licenses every two years by June 30. Last names beginning with A - M renew on odd years, N - Z on even years. Individual renewal notices are typically mailed in early May. You can renew online at [www.kyboels.ky.gov](http://www.kyboels.ky.gov).

The engineering continuing education regulation ([201 KAR 18:196](#)) requires 30 hours of continuing education in the two calendar years preceding the June 30 renewal. A maximum of 15 hours may be carried over to the next reporting period.

You are responsible for maintaining your records. On your license renewal form, you will be asked to indicate whether or not you have met the continuing education requirements. If selected for an audit, you will be asked to provide the supporting documents.

"Please remember to renew on time," said Ken Sperry, Chairman of the Kentucky Board of Engineers and Land Surveyors. "Late payments will most likely result in an audit of the continuing education requirements."
